## **ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE**

On October 15, 2009, Plaintiff filed a motion for an order to show cause why Defendants should not be held in contempt. (Doc. No. 141.) On October 16, the Court issued an order to show cause why this motion should not be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction. (Doc. No. 158.) Plaintiff filed its response on October 21, 2009. (Doc. No. 161.) Having reviewed Plaintiff's response, the Court finds that it has shown good cause as to this Court's jurisdiction to enforce its judgment.

Therefore, Plaintiff's motion for an order to show cause is **GRANTED**. Defendants Thomas Villwock, James M. Danforth, G7 Productivity Systems, iProlog Corporation and FreeQuick Wire Corporation **SHALL APPEAR** before this Court on <u>February 16, 2010, at 9:00 am</u> to show cause why this Court should not find them in civil contempt for failing to comply with the requirements of the Final Order.

Defendants shall serve Plaintiff Federal Trade Commission any documentary evidence on which they will rely at the show cause hearing no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the hearing,

If Defendants intend to present the testimony of any witness at the show cause hearing, they shall serve the Commission, by electronic mail to lschneider@ftc.gov and by overnight delivery to the above address, no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the hearing, a statement containing the name, address, and telephone number of any such witness.
